A Certain Rich Man

- Clothed in purple and fine linen Vs. 19
- Fared Sumptuously
- The rich man died and was buried
- And in hell he lifted up his eyes being tormented
- And saw Abraham a far off and Lazarus in his bosom

Vs. 25 – 31

- And he cried to Abraham, "Have mercy on me."
- Send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water
- But Abraham said, "Remember, you in your lifetime received your good;
- And likewise, "Lazarus received evil."
- But now he is comforted and you are tormented
- And beside all this, there is a gulf fixed
- No one can come and no one can go
- Abraham said, "They have Moses and the prophets."

A Certain Beggar

- Lazarus Vs. 20-24
- Laid at his gate full of sores
- Desiring to be fed with crumbs
- Which fell from the rich man's table
- The dogs licked his sores
- The beggar died
- Carried into Abraham's Bosom by angels

- "I pray that you would send him to my fathers' house
- I have five brethren, that he may testify to them

Lazarus

- He said, "No, if one went unto them from the dead they will repent."
- And he said unto him, "If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded by one from the dead."
